## Author Guidelines

### 1. Aims and Scope

The *International Journal of Arabian Sea* publishes original research articles, reviews, short communications, case studies, and policy perspectives related to:

- Marine fisheries and aquaculture
- Marine ecology and biodiversity
- Oceanography and climate impacts
- Fishing technology and innovation
- Coastal communities, socio-economics & governance
- Marine pollution, plastics, and sustainability
- Transboundary fisheries and regional cooperation

Submissions must be scientifically sound, original, and relevant to the Arabian Sea region.

### 2. Types of Articles

IJAS accepts the following categories:

1. **Original Research Articles** (5,000–8,000 words)
2. **Review Articles** (6,000–10,000 words, invited or proposed)
3. **Short Communications** (2,000–3,000 words)
4. **Technical Notes** (1,500–2,500 words)
5. **Case Studies / Field Reports**
6. **Policy Briefs & Commentary**
7. **Perspectives / Opinion Pieces** (on invitation)

### 3. Submission Checklist

Before submitting, ensure:

- Manuscript follows IJAS structure (see Section 4).
- All authors approve the submission.
- All ethical, funding, and conflict-of-interest statements are included.
- Figures are high resolution (300 dpi minimum).
- References follow **APA / Elsevier Harvard style**.
- Manuscript is an original work and not under review elsewhere.

### 4. Manuscript Structure

#### 4.1 Title Page

Include:

- Title (concise and informative)
- Author names and affiliations
- Corresponding author details
- ORCID IDs (recommended)
- Acknowledgements
- Funding information
- Conflict of interest declaration

## 4.2 Abstract

A structured abstract (200–250 words):

- Background
- Objectives
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusions
- Keywords (4–6)

## 4.3 Main Text

Use the following structure:

- 1. Introduction**
- 2. Materials and Methods**
- 3. Results**
- 4. Discussion**
- 5. Conclusion and References**

For Reviews, use thematic headings.

## 5. Formatting Requirements

- Font: Times New Roman, 12 pt
- Line spacing: 1.5
- Margins: 1 inch on all sides
- File formats: .docx or .rtf (no PDFs for initial review)
- Number all tables and figures sequentially
- Provide captions below figures and above tables

## 6. Figures, Tables & Illustrations

- Figures: TIFF/JPEG/PNG, minimum 300 dpi
- Tables: Editable, not images
- Colour figures allowed

- Each figure/table must be cited in the text

## 7. References

Use **Elsevier Harvard style** or **APA 7th**.

### **Journal article:**

### **Book:**

Magada, S. (2025). *Blue Book of India*. SeaMC<sup>2</sup> Publications.

Singh, A. (2023). Coastal livelihoods. In R. Mehta (Ed.), *Ocean Studies* (pp. 55–72). Springer.

## 8. Ethical Considerations

Authors must confirm:

- Ethical approval for studies involving animals or humans
- No plagiarism, duplication, or data fabrication
- Proper acknowledgements of collaborators and funding bodies
- Permissions for reproduced materials are obtained

## 9. Conflict of Interest

All authors must declare any financial or personal relationships that could influence the work.

## 10. Peer Review Process

- Initial editorial screening
- Double-blind peer review by at least two reviewers
- Revision cycle before acceptance
- Final decision by Editor-in-Chief

**11. Copyright** Authors retain copyright. Upon acceptance, authors grant IJAS the right to publish the work under its Open-Access policy.

**12. Article Processing Charges:** Initially, it charged Rs. 2000 per article. Once the NAAS rating reaches above 5.0, it will be revised.

### 13. Proofs

Authors will receive page proofs for minor corrections. Substantive revisions are not allowed at this stage.
